Please note: Students who believe that they are competent in reading, writing, and speaking a language that is not offered at Loyola may make a request to the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) Dean's Office for a competency exam in that language. This request should be filed during a student's first semester in the College of Arts and Sciences. For the purpose of competency testing in languages not offered at Loyola, the CAS Dean's Office will recognize only languages which can be tested for competency in reading, writing, and speaking. Once this request is submitted, the CAS Dean's Office will make a limited but reasonable effort to locate an academically qualified tester at Loyola or at another college or university. Once a qualified tester has been located, the student will be notified and directed to make an appointment for an examination which, in most cases, will be conducted in the CAS Dean's Office and/or the Language Learning Resource Center. After the competency exam has been administered, the exam will be submitted to the language tester for review, and the language tester will submit a report and recommendation to the CAS Dean's Office. If no qualified tester can be found within one academic semester, the student's request will be denied, and the student will be required to satisfy the CAS language competency requirement via language course work at the 102-level or higher (or, if an International Studies major or minor, the 104- or 103-level respectively).
